

10 Early Warning Signs of a Learning Disability:



1

Behind in a subject area compared to peers

2

Being consistently inconsistent in a particular thing. Example: Always having trouble decoding multisyllabic words

3

Difficulty following instructions on an assignment

4

A follow up to #3: A student may turn in incomplete work because that person can not comprehend what to do

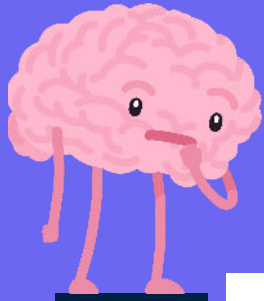
5

A student may “act out” when asked to do something and/ or “avoid” certain tasks

6

Needing constant repetition of something that they have previously learned

Gets confused with the alphabet, days of the week, counting, months, etc.

8

For dyslexia: Trouble connecting letters to sounds to the actual word

9

For dyscalculia: trouble matching the spelled out word to a) the number or b) the quantity. For example knowing the word f-i-v-e spelled out matches to the number 5 and/or the quantity of 5 items. There might be a disconnect with a student's ability to do this.

10

For dyslexia: common challenges include skipping lines or words, substituting a word with another that is similar, or reading a word correctly on one page but incorrectly on the next.

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
